- Say the first two lines of the rhyme, encouraging your child to curl up into a tiny seed and then slowly uncurl and grow into a flower.
- For the next lines skip around in a circle holding hands.
- Try singing the <u>Flower Bud song</u> by the Kiboomers. Add hand actions for *flower buds, sunshine, raindrops, open flowers, one by one.*
- Listen to the <u>Flower Duet</u>, performed by Edsential Music Tutors. Use floaty material or scarfs and twirl, uncurl, sway, float around the room. You could try making a flower collage out of brightly coloured materials or paper as you listen. - Have fun adding actions to the rhyme- trace circular movements with your index finger, on the palm of your child's hand.
 - Slowly walk your fingers up your child's arm '1 step, 2 step...
 - Then tickle your child under their arm 'And a tickle under there'.

Explore a variety of sounds, maybe making instruments – these can be homemade. Find different ways of playing them and ask your child, 'Can you make a swirling sound? Can you make footsteps with your instrument?'

And then some flower seeds, (scatter pretend seeds on palm, or tickle your child's palms)

The sun will shine, (circular action with your hands)

And the rain will fall, (fingers flutter down)

And my garden will blossom and grow straight and tall (cup hands and 'grow' fingers upwards like flowers).

As you sing the song, dance or skip around in a circle. Add extra verses with actions for everyday routines such as:

This is the way we **brush our teeth**..... This is the way we **comb our hair**......

This is the way we **tidy up**.....

- Try singing it fast then slow, then loud then quiet
- The rhythm of the rhyme has a bouncy, skipping feel to it. Ask your child to bounce or dance their favourite teddy bear on their knee as you sing it together.
- Or listen to 'Country Garden' as you do this.
