Step 1: Hi there! Click [here](#) to find out what we are going to learn to play today.

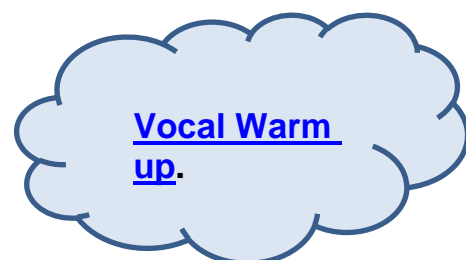


Step 2: Catherine Singleton (the tutor for this lesson) has made a video introducing herself. Click [here](#) to find out more.
