The Code of Practice 2015

Four Broad Areas of Need

Four broad areas of need give an overview of the range of needs that should be planned for, not to fit a pupil into a category:

- Communication and interaction
- Cognition and learning
- Social, emotional and mental health
- Sensory and/or physical needs.

“SEN Provision is education or training which is additional to / different from that which is made for other children of the same age in mainstream schools/settings. – That which is not ordinarily available.”

Service Level Agreements

Introduction

Following ongoing discussions with schools and feedback from SENCo's and Headteachers, the new SEND, Inclusion and Mental Health Service Level Agreements have been adapted:

1. To provide schools with additional control over what support they receive
2. To ensure schools only get the support they require and aligned their needs
3. To enable schools to add to their SLA at different times of the year in line with increased need
4. All Service Level Agreements will run for the length of the academic year (September 2020 – July 2021)

How to buy a Service Level Agreement for the 20/21 academic year

1. Check the list of services below and the credits associated with each one
2. Select the number of credits you need. Please note that you can buy credits at any point of the year and on more than one occasion
3. Click on to the link to book this number of credits
4. You will receive an email notification confirming your purchase
5. A member of our team will be in touch to help you plan how you wish to use your credits

SLA's can be bought at anytime during the academic year as long as they can be delivered during the above period.

Schools can still buy individual services and support and access training as and when needed.

Schools can buy a set of credits at multiple times throughout the year.

To ensure a well planned service and effective delivery of support, we would encourage schools to select their Service Level Agreement options as soon as possible.
