




Virtuoso - our NEW online choir

- ✓ Elicit positive emotions and engender a strong sense of connectedness with others
- ✓ Distract children from negativity and stress, improve their mood and help them to feel safe, calm and comfortable
- ✓ Give children a channel through which they can express emotion, ideas and find their voice in the world
- ✓ Teach and develop good vocal technique
- ✓ Help to improve mood, memory and cognitive performance



Virtuoso takes place every Wednesday and is **free** to any child in a school who is having music lessons with Edsential this academic year. Membership includes access to music centres and all other ensembles and online activities.
