Training

Access to the National Curriculum Teaching Programme, delivered in the local area. This programme allows school staff to support the teaching of school swimming by taking a small group of swimmers.

Costs

The cost of a 30 minute session is £75 (£65 at Caldy), not including transport.

The cost of transport is £65 per return journey

Swimming and the PE and Sport Premium

Primary PE and Sports Premium funding can only be spent on additional or enhanced swimming activities – above the minimum requirements of the national curriculum.

Top-Up Swimming

Additional lessons for pupils who may be struggling to learn to swim, or who would be nefit from extra support with certain strokes or techniques. Available as daily 30 minute sessions for one or two weeks.
