Add colour

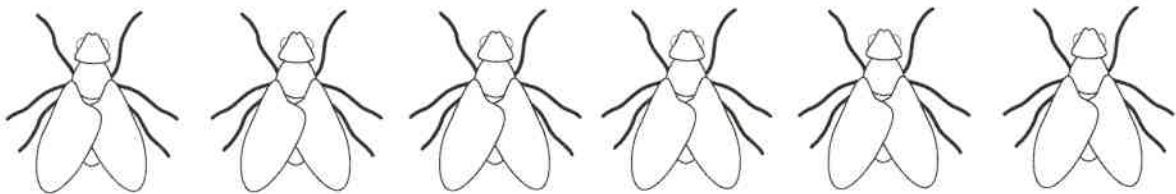
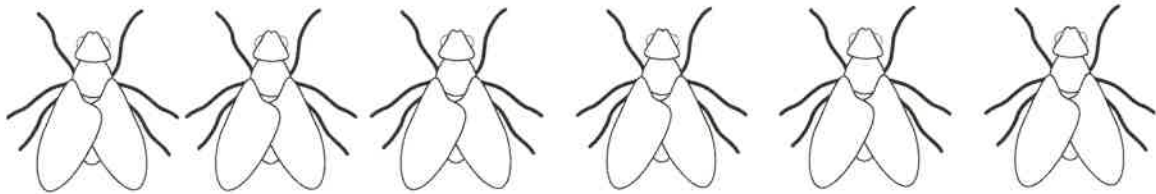
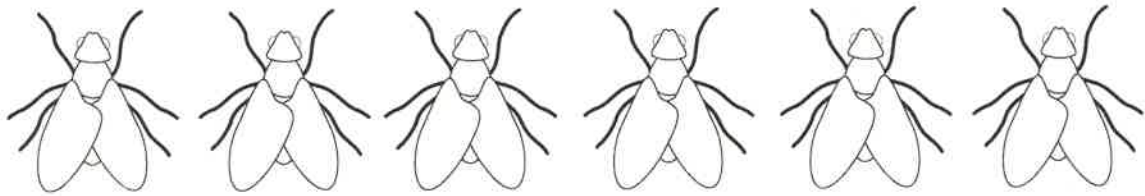
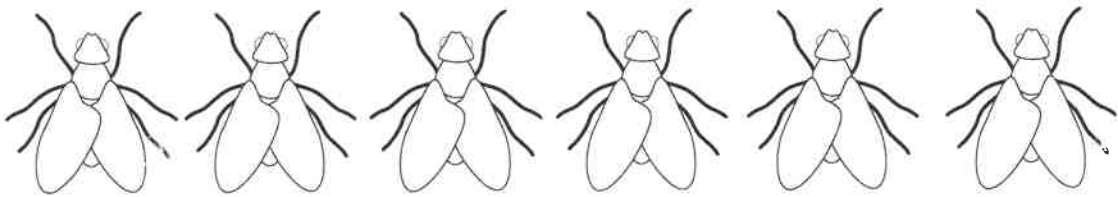
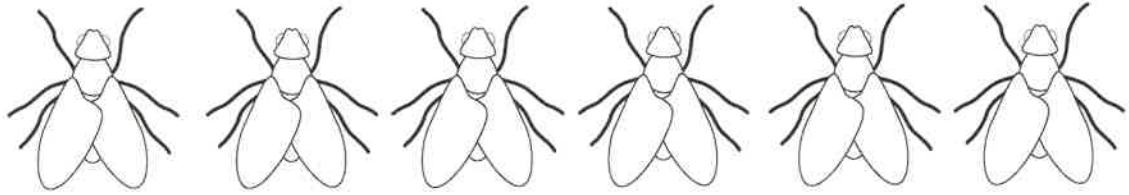
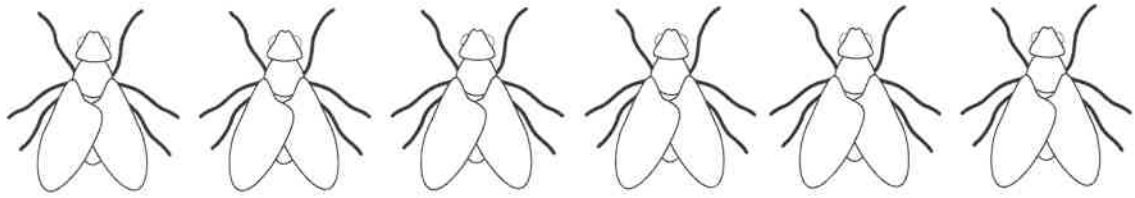
Attach legs to folded end underneath and add arms to the other end

Colour fly and attach to string

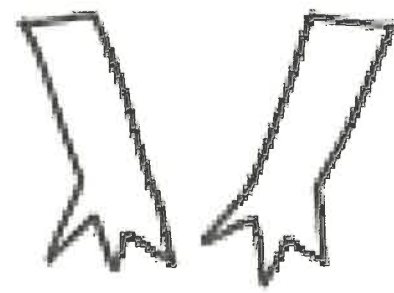
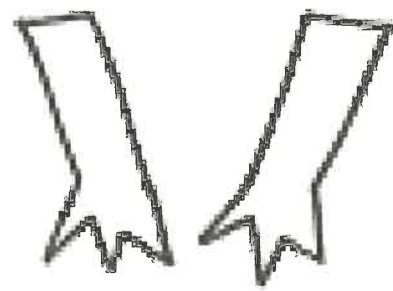
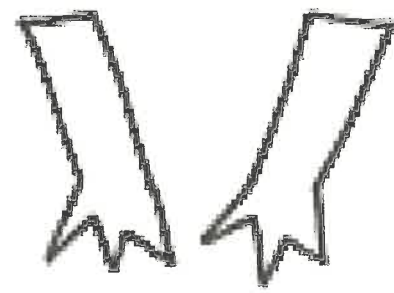
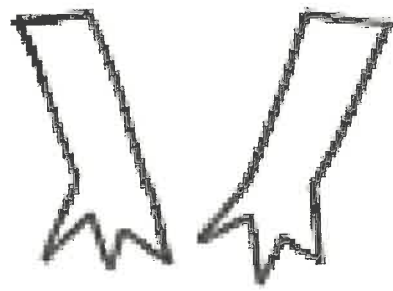
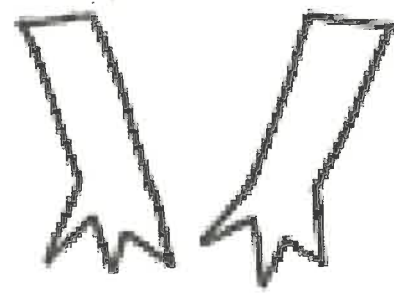
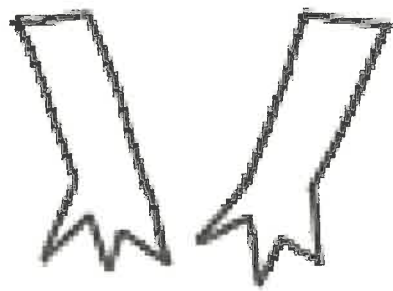
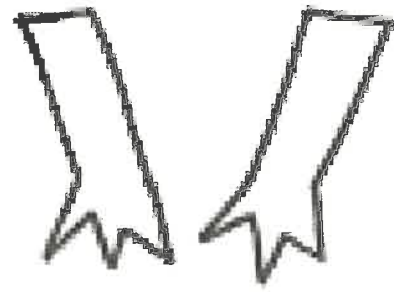
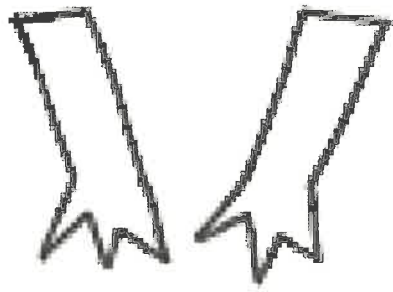
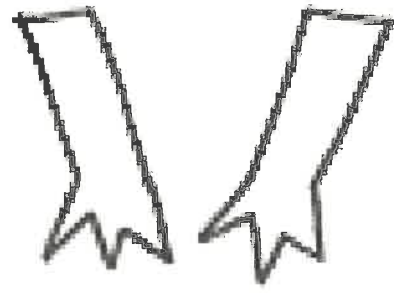
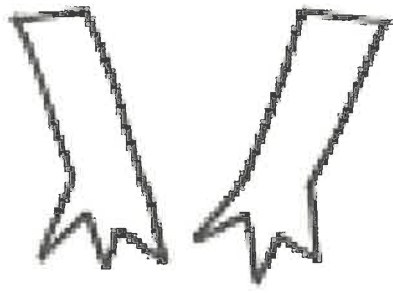
Attach string to inside of the frogs mouth

Add googley eyes

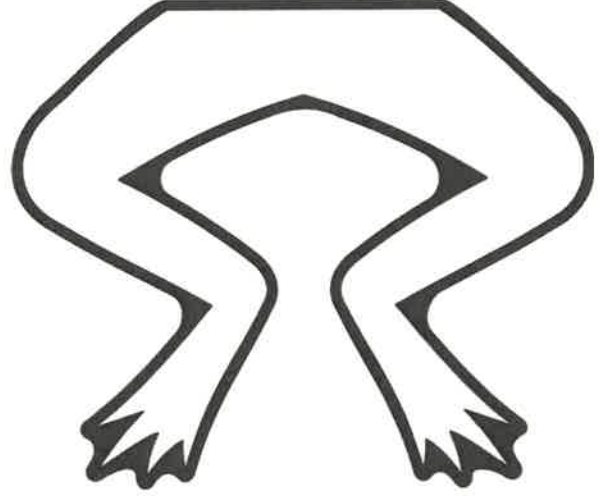
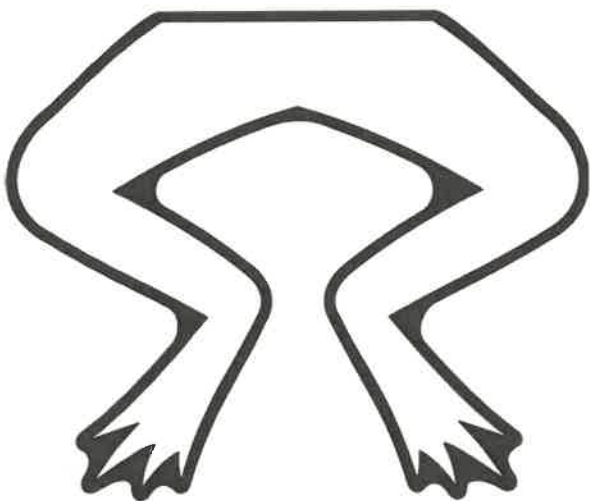
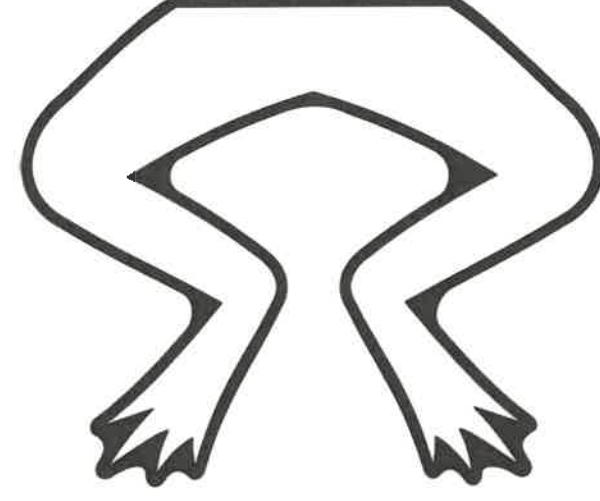
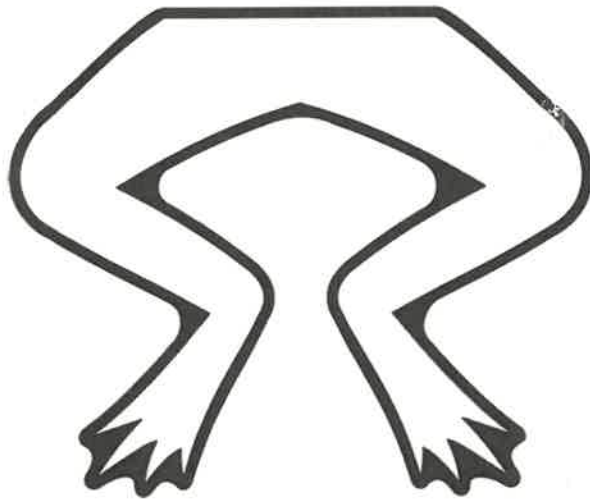
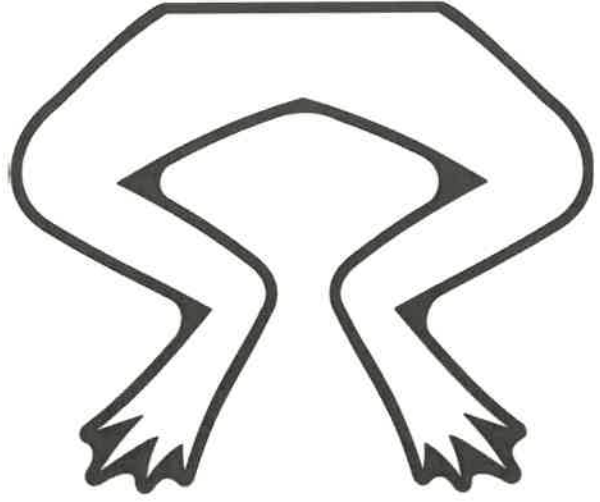
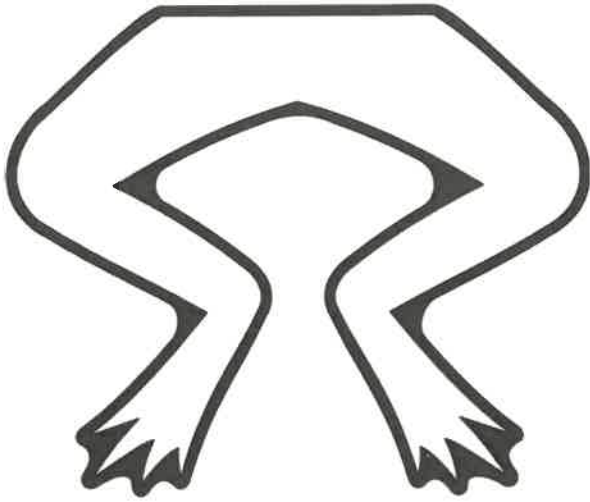

# BUG HOTEL



## Resources

Toilet paper rolls, Milk Carton, Acrylic paint, Large straws or rolled up piece of paper, Moss, Dried grass, Pinecones, Twigs, Leaves, Fishing net, Stones, Rolled paper, Craft knife, Black dot stickers

## What to do

1. Cut a large opening on one side of the milk carton using a craft knife.
2. Paint the outside of the milk carton red. Set aside to dry.
3. Decorate with black dot stickers so that it looks like a ladybug.
4. Seal the paint with water proof sealer, especially if you want to keep your bug hotel outside in an area where it can get wet.
5. Grab and insert 7-8 toilet paper rolls into the milk carton.
6. Start by adding some dried grass or moss around the sides of the rolls and in the back of the milk carton.
7. Then start to fill each tube. Fill one with moss, another with sticks, another with rolled up pieces of paper. another with more moss, another with pine cones and another with cut paper straws. Fill another with twigs. Fill another with pebbles.
8. Fill in the sides of the milk carton with rocks, dried grass, sticks and pine cones or moss.
9. Make a sign out of cardboard reading BUG HOTEL!
10. Place it outside and watch ants, ladybugs, spiders and maybe bees move in!

# Spider Webs



**Resources:**  
twigs  
string  
leaves  
glue  
plastic insects

## **Instructions:**

**Take 4 sticks. Lay across one another to make a star shape. Secure at the centre with string. Take a length of string and thread between the sticks, twisting around each stick to secure. Repeat this 5 times to create web, as in picture. Decorate with leaves and add plastic bugs and spiders. Glue in place.**

# Butterfly & snail mosaics



**Resources:**  
card  
scissors  
beans and seeds  
glue  
pencils



## **Instructions:**

**Draw a snail or butterfly shape on card and cut out.**

**Apply glue to the card and decorate with beans and seeds in a mosaic design.**



# Talking stick



**Resources: sticks, threads, ribbons, pom-poms, beads**

**Instructions: In groups, children decorate stick by each tying a ribbon or thread onto the stick and adding a bead of their initial.**



# VOLCANO

## You will need:

- cardboard ✓
- empty plastic bottle ✓
- sticky tape ✓
- foil
- newspaper strips ✓
- water ✓
- flour
- paints ✓
- bicarbonate of soda ✓
- red food colouring ✓
- vinegar



# Volcano

1. Tip into hole at the top of the volcano 2 to 3 teaspoons of bicarb of soda
2. Add a few drops of red food colouring
3. Pour in vinegar
4. Watch volcano explode

# t-shirt bag



## resources

- old t-shirt
- scissors
- pens

## what to do

Draw along the sleeve lines and draw a 'U' shape starting from the collar meeting back at the top

cut along the lines

Along the bottom of the t-shirt cut strips up around 6cm high ensuring that both back and front are together and cut the same thickness.

tie each strip (back and front) together

(turn top inside out if you want to keep the pattern)

## NATURE AFTERNOON PART 2



### Resources

- Coloured paper
- Scissors
- Paper
- Glue

### What to do

1. After our nature trees are completed.
2. we are going to create these birds.
3. Coloured card to be given to each child preferably 3 different colours.
4. Children will draw their hands on 2 of the 3 colours.
5. cut out the hand drawings.
6. draw a birds body and beak.
7. Cut out
8. Stick together creating bird.

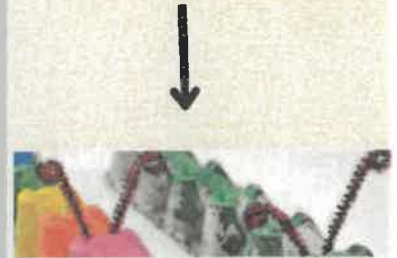
We will then place the bird on children's nature tree.



# The Hungry Caterpillar



osmeterium



what you will need:

- 6x different coloured card strips for body
- 1x straw
- 1x sheet of green card for the leaf
- black card or pipe cleaners for the osmeterium

step. 1 roll each piece of coloured paper on its self to create a cylinder shape.

step 2. using the double sided sticky tape stick all the rolls together at this point add in either pipe cleaners or card cut out for the osmeterium .

step 3. chose witch end you want to be the head and draw on your caterpillars face and then set aside.

step 4. using the green piece of paper fold in half and cut out a leaf shape.

step 5. still keeping the leaf folded from the stem end fold back and forth like your making a paper fan until its all folded on its self and then open back out. (this gives the leaf texture).

Step 6. Using the straw wrap around a strip of the off cuts from the leaf piece of paper make a slip through for the straw.

step 7 attach slip through onto the leaf (near bottom of the leaf).

step 8. test straw through the slip through on the leaf. if you are happy it moves through attach the head of the caterpillar to the top of the straw and thread the straw through the slip through.

step 9. attach the bottom end to the slip through.

you should now have a moving caterpillar

## PAPER PLATE FRISBEE



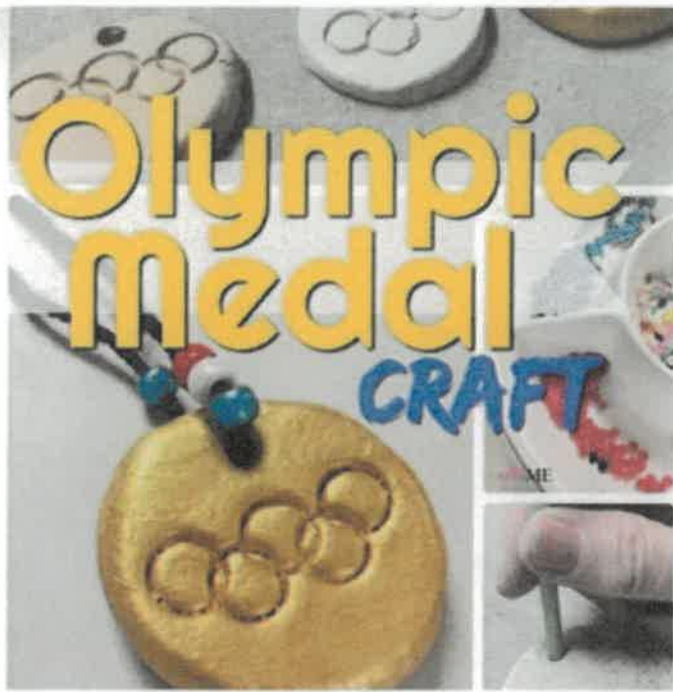
### Resources

- Paper plates
- Colours
- Scissors

### What to do

1. Give children 2 paper plates each.
2. Children cut a circle in the middle of the plate, staff help if needed
3. Children decorate each side of the paper plate.
4. When decorated glue the paper plates together.





**Resources:**  
**Air dry clay**  
**straw**  
**ribbon**  
**gold paint**  
**pencil**

**Instructions:**

**Take a small piece of clay and roll in hands until soft and pliable. Carefully shape into a disc shape, flattening with hand.**

**Use a straw to push a hole through the disc in the top centre. Use a sharp pencil to push 5 circles into the clay - as above.**

**Leave to dry.**

**when fully dry, paint disc.**

**Once paint is dry, thread a length of ribbon through the whole.**



# BREAD MAKING



## Resources

Zip lock bag

3 cups strong bread flour – you can use all purpose flour but add an extra teaspoon of yeast  
pinch of salt

1 packet of active dry yeast or 7g of easy-bake yeast

2 tablespoons of vegetable or sunflower oil (you can replace this with butter if you wish)

1 cup of warm water

1 tablespoon of sugar

## What to do

1. Put all ingredients into a zip lock bag.
2. Mix/knead well ensuring all ingredients have combined together.
3. It takes about 5 – 10 minutes to knead the dough into a nice smooth dough.
4. Leaving the bread to proof in the zip lock bags and the children can then take the bread home in the bag with a sheet of how long to bake for.

# Pasta Hedgehog



**Resources:**  
Card  
pasta bows  
paint  
paint brushes  
pen  
glue  
pompoms

## **Instructions:**

**Draw a hedgehog shape on a piece of card. Select a paint colour and paint each piece of pasta on both sides. Leave to dry.**

**Next, paint the hedgehog, leaving out face and feet.**

**When the pasta is completely dry, arrange on the painted part of the hedgehog and glue into place.**

**Draw in eyes and mouth. Add a pompom nose.**
